

ABSW Shares Gratitude for Your Support

We are in receipt of two letters dated October 20 and November 17 from American Baptist Seminary of the West (ABSW) Vice President Michelle Holmes and President and Professor of Pastoral Theology, Dr. Paul Martin, respectively, expressing thanksgiving for your gifts of \$384.37 in October and \$505.26 in November.

"The classroom environment," shares Vice President Holmes, "is enhanced by the cultural diversity of our students who share out of their life experiences and faith journeys. ..In the course of interpreting a well known Biblical text, the students became teachers to each other as they shared from their own experiences and in so doing, opened their peers to a new understanding of God's grace. The classroom was no longer simply a room to impart theoretical education; it had become a laboratory for minis-

try".

And President Martin in part, concludes his letter with the following words, "...I am overjoyed at the wonderful people who continue to support the efforts of our great institution by providing these magnificent gifts for the continuing work of our institution..."

BTS Partners with First Baptist Church—Palo Alto in Mission Outreach

Balasore Technical School (BTS) sent a \$2,000 donation to be added to the mission outreach funds of First Baptist Church Palo Alto (FBCPA. Ramesh Kumar, BTS Principal, and Rev. Samaresh Nayak, head of Bengal-Orissa-Bihar Baptist Churches, visited Palo Alto on their way home from attending a Baptist World Alliance meeting in July 2010. "I have seen your outreach work while I was in the USA last year, Ramesh said.

The Mission Task Team, asked by the Council to decide how to use the funds, made this decision:

- 1. \$500 was given to the Opportunity Center (along with our September outreach offering), which BTS had visited and met the Director, Mr. Dah.
- 2. \$500 will be given to Ecumeni-

cal Hunger Program in November along with our offerings, noting its source.

3. A \$500 donation has been made to UCCM at Stanford with an explanation about its for-credit class on Liberation Theology and the annual trip to El Salvador for students, the campus minister, and a Memorial Church Dean. UCCM also encourages students to work on a Stanford student Habitat project. (They had seen a Habitat project of FBCPA.)

The President of UCCM Board wrote about this gift: "How wonderful! To think that our ministry at Stanford is receiving financial support from a school in India—this sort of serendipity could not be made up! 'BTS wants to be on the giving end as well as the receiving end'—How inspirational!".

4. A \$500 gift will make it possible for FBCPA to offer financial support in 2012 to both Dan & Sarah Chetti in Lebanon and Dan Buttry, peace advocate. The Chettis are natives of India and Dan Chetti lived in Calcutta when his father taught there. Dan Buttry visited Orissa twice in 2008 during a period of violence against Christians and also participated in interfaith workshops in Balasore in 2011. The Chettis and Buttry will be informed That BTS is the source of the financial support.

After reading about the uses of the gifts Ramesh wrote in a recent email: "thanks for the information about the utility of our contribution. We are thankful to God that He is using our small contribution in a bigger and meaningful way."

The Influence of Long Term Missionaries—Nzunga & Kihomi Part I

Report from Dennis Shewell, MPT Team Leader for Nzunga & Kihomi

I just returned from Haiti where I led a group of 10 others to learn first hand about Nzunga and Kihomi's ministry there. We had a diverse group ranging in age from 26 to 75. Five ABC churches were represented along with one Catholic church, one large New Albany IN church and one large Louisville KY church.

We were met at the airport in Cap-Haitian by Nzunga after a 2 1/2 hour flight from Ft Lauderdale. Nzunga wore a badge that allowed him access to anywhere in the airport. As friends of Nzunga we were quickly put thru customs and out of the airport. Our baggage arrived four hours later on another flight but again since we were with Nzunga there was no checking of bags and no fees.

For the remainder of the trip, again and again this was played out, we were met by his past students in their long sleeve shirts and ties...a status symbol that you are a college grad and have a position of responsibility. At the schools we visited, the new hospital being built, when we were at the border of the Dominican Republic it was the same; special privileges for friends of Nzunga.

Kihomi's work with the women of the Haitian Baptist Convention was also evident everywhere. Whenever we introduced Papa Fred, the husband of Mama Sharon, who supports Kihomi's work by sending large amounts of items that can not be purchased in Haiti or the ladies can't afford them if they were, many would hold up something they had received from her or point to their clothing.

It seemed as if we could not

go anywhere, even driving down the street, that there would not be someone shouting a greeting to one or both of them.

In a country that it is easy to see the overwhelming problems, what a wonderful testimony of goodwill and love they have created in northern Haiti. Who they are and what they stand for was evident from the time we landed to when we left.

Smiles, hugs and joyous welcomes everywhere!

Last Meeting of ABHMS's 35-Member Board

VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 11/21/11)—In a historic American Baptist moment in time, the Board of National Ministries met for the last time in Orlando, Fla., Nov. 16-18, in accordance with American Baptist Churches USA (ABCUSA) bylaw changes passed in June at Biennial meetings in San Juan. Puerto Rico. The current 35-member board will be reorganized with 16 members as the Board of Directors of American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS), as of January 1, 2012. Members of the Board of National Ministries voted unanimously to elect directors and officers of ABHMS, recommended by the Governance Committee as follows: Class A Directors (one year): James H. Callaway Jr., First Baptist Church (FBC), Junction City, Kan.; Sherman L. Lambert, Purity Baptist Church, Washington, W.Va.; Kevin "Scotty" Robertson, FBC, Grantsville, W.Va.; Eleanor Siegrist, FBC,

Hollidaysburg, Pa.; Laura Sinclair, Parkchester Baptist Church, Bronx, N.Y.; and Wallace C. Smith, Shiloh Baptist Church, Washington, D.C.: Class B Directors (two years): Kenneth R. Board, Pilgrim Baptist Church, Rockford IL: Garth E. Brokaw. Lake Avenue Baptist Church, Rochester NY; Wendy J. Hagn (secretary 2012-2014), FBC, Franklin IN; Clifford I. Johnson (president 2012-2014), Shiloh Baptist Church, Wilmington, DE; Jay Rambo, FBC, Bordentown NJ: Robert C. Scott, Central Baptist Church, St. Louis MO; and Class C Directors (three years): Lois M. Chiles (vice president 2012-2014), FBC, Leavenworth, KS; David C. Gregg, Grace Baptist Church, Chicago IL; Antonio L. Lombardi, Church of the Master, Providence, RI; and Brazilian Thurman (Finance Committee Chair 2012), Calvary Baptist Church, Milwaukee, WI.

...Executive Director Aidsand F. Wright-Riggins III pointed out the theme of the meeting—"Engaging Discipleship: Open Eyes, Hearts and

Hands" (Mark 10:46-52), inspired by the upcoming America for Christ (AFC) Offering theme—lifts up the ABHMS mission of helping people equip themselves to live as disciples in their daily lives. "We really do need to be engaged in partnership with local churches to call forth missionaries who do mission in their communities," he said.

In a closing worship service of thanksgiving and commissioning, board members were invited to celebrate and affirm three intentions: to follow Christ more nearly, love Christ more dearly and incarnate Christ more clearly; and to ask three daily questions: How shall I follow Christ today? How can I demonstrate compassion to people and creation today? How can I practice the presence of Christ right here and right now?

MMBB Reports Average ABCUSA Compensation Increases Nearly 1%

NEW YORK, NY, November 10, 2011 – The Ministers and Missionaries Benefit Board ("MMBB") has finalized the results of its 2011 compensation analysis. The study found that the average compensation among American Baptist Churches USA pastors was \$52,446. This represents a nearly 1% increase over the 2010 average of \$52,028.

"While the year-over-year increase may seem low, we believe that our churches are compensating at appropriate levels given the state of the economy and the impact this has had on church giving," noted Reverend Dr. Perry Hopper, MMBB's associate executive director and head of denominational relations. "This annual compensation study is just one of the ways MMBB works to promote interest in the better maintenance of the ministry."

To focus on full-time pastors, the study included those with reported compensation greater than \$12,000. A chart detailing the comparison from 2010 to 2011 by region is also available upon request.

"Understanding average compensation is important, especially in these challenging economic times, for both churches and for pastors," explained Rev. Dr. Hopper. "ABCUSA and church leaders use our compensation analysis to determine fair compensation for their pastoral leaders."

NOTE: Evergreen's average compensation grew from \$61,118 in 2010 to \$62,059 in 2011 or a 1.5% increase.
