## Caucus Workshops Update & Upcoming Black Caucus Workshop

Eric Law states in *The Wolf Shall Dwell with the Lamb*, "Justice in a multicultural setting has to be approached in an "ethnorelative" way. We begin by accepting the reality that people's power perceptions are different because of cultural differences. ... In a multicultural community, we can no longer train leaders ethnocentrically. We can no longer assume everyone is like us in their power perception. We can no longer do justice by simple physical inclusion. We must move from our ethnocentric way to an ethnorelative way of doing justice." (p.

35-36) That's why we are having caucus meetings and an All-Caucus gathering. We must first understand our own perceptions of power, then understand others and find ways to move forward together.

The Asian Caucus met. Reports were that it was very helpful, and they enjoyed discovering their differences and learning from one another for the brief time they were together.

The Euro Caucus met. Reports were that it was very helpful. They are discovering more and more who they are and

learning from one another, instead of just assuming who they are and doing things the way they have always done them. There is still work to do, but they are gaining ability to do their work more justly each time they meet.

The Black Caucus leadership will be meeting to plan their gathering to be held on Saturday, April 22 at Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Baptist Church. Registration forms are already available in churches. If you are a member of a Black Caucus church, please

During the two years participants are given about 10 books to help them on their path of walking with God. The leaders during the training are current pastors and leaders, so the teaching is done from

current experience, not from experts that did it right once.

Each "weekend" costs \$100, for a total of \$1,000 for the two year experience (payable week-end by weekend). It covers not only the cost of the textbooks, but also a light breakfast, lunch and dinner on Friday and light breakfast and lunch on Saturday and snacks to keep you going during the days. We will be meeting at a local church.

Scholarships are available from ABC/USA for pastors and we will work with churches to make this possible for their leaders. Don't let the costs stop you from enrolling.

and the inclusion of the Leadership ID #s a church may use as part of their log on should the church decide to submit the data on-line. You will find all other areas of the form to be as you remember them from previous years.

Please complete as much of the information as possible since your information is necessary for the denomination and region

to have current, accurate information on our member churches.

Whether a church submits the Annual Report on-line or sends the completed form to the region office, it would be helpful to have the information-completed by April 30, 2006.

members who for a long time have not been asked to define who you were. The people of color have lived with this, yet have not been asked to identify who they are as determined by the caucuses - separate but equal. We are reminded that, in

physical exercising, we find muscles we didn't know we had. Thus, in the same way, our stretching out of our comfort zone will become relational strengthening for which we will be grateful.

I am intrigued with the EBA concept of "bridge

building." We are familiar with human relations, but when viewed in the likeness of that of Jesus who said, John 15:12, NLT, "I command you to love each other in the same way that I love you," we are humbled. Our loving is the "bridging," is it not? We,

## Workshop Descriptions

### Morning Sessions

#### 1. *Mission Strategies for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century World*

**Instructor:** Reverend Dr. Raymond Bakke

This workshop is designed to equip the local church to do effective and relevant home and foreign mission in the 21<sup>st</sup> century world. Emphasis will first be given to informing workshop participants of the critical political, economic, and social developments that shape the mission agenda for today's Church. Secondly, participants will be introduced to new strategies for accomplishing mission objectives under current national and global conditions.

#### 2. *Developing and Implementing the Vision for Your Church*

**Instructor:** Reverend Marlin Harris

This workshop is designed to equip pastors, church staff, and church officers with a methodology for developing and implementing a "shared vision" for congregational growth and ministry development in their local church. Strategies will be given for creating excitement, building trust, managing conflict and increasing buy-in throughout the change process.

#### 3. *Nurturing the Multi-Cultural Congregation*

**Instructor:** Rev. Dr. Heidi Newmark

This workshop is designed to equip pastors, church leaders and church members with the tools to create genuine faith community and understanding among congregants from diverse racial and cultural backgrounds. Workshop participants will be introduced to effective strategies for managing conflict that arises from difference.

#### 4. *Developing the Dynamic Music Ministry*

**Instructor:** Rev. Nolan Williams

This workshop will address the spiritual development of a music staff and choir members. Learn about enhancing musical technique, both vocal and instrumental. Attention will be given to the integration of all worship arts, including dance, mime, drama, and spoken word, etc. Learn how to establish a music ministry that masters both traditional and contemporary styles of sacred music.

### Afternoon Sessions

#### 5. *Preaching Through Congregational Conflict and Transition*

**Instructor:** Rev. Dr. Gary Simpson

This workshop is designed to equip pastors with the tools to responsibly and constructively address congregational conflicts during the preaching moment. Participants will also be given guidance in how to avoid the temptation of developing a "reactionary pulpit" during difficult congregational seasons.

#### 6. *Effective Models of Christian Education and Faith Formation*

**Instructor:** Rev. Kathi R. Chavous

This workshop will introduce participants to creative and fresh models in "life long faith formation." Emphasis will be given to the development of curricula that is culturally and age sensitive. Also creative teaching techniques, including use of new technologies, will be introduced.

#### 7. *Developing Effective Leaders for a Healthy Church*

**Instructor:** Rev. Dr. Anthony Robinson

This workshop will distinguish between the healthy and the unhealthy congregation, and then identify and contrast healthy vs. unhealthy leadership behaviors. The objective is to present a model for training and/or retraining healthy church leadership that in turn can develop a spiritually and relationally healthy congregation.

#### 8. *Taking Christ to the Hip Hop Generation*

**Instructor:** Rev. Melvin Maxwell

This workshop is designed to help pastors and adults youth workers to better understand the dynamics of Hip Hop culture and to introduce them to successful models of ministry to today's youth. Emphasis will be given to how to train prospective adult youth workers to effectively reach youth and to successfully implement the appropriate youth ministry model for their local church.
